CLINT BLACK RETURNS TO STAGE ONE IN AUGUST

*Award-winning and bestselling,
Clint Black has stayed true to his roots.*

(July 2, 2018; Folsom, CA) His is one of the most storied careers in modern music. Clint Black surged to superstardom as part of the fabled Class of '89, reaching #1 with five consecutive singles from his triple-platinum debut, *Killin' Time*. He followed that with the triple-platinum *Put Yourself in My Shoes*, and then a string of platinum and gold albums throughout the '90s.

Kicking off the 2018-19 Season of Performing Arts, Harris Center is proud to welcome back to Stage One a legend in country music. Clint wrote or co-wrote every one of his more than three dozen chart hits, including "A Better Man," "Where Are You Now," "When My Ship Comes In," "A Good Run of Bad Luck," "Summer's Comin'," "Like the Rain" and "Nothin' But the Taillights" — all part of a catalog that produced 22 #1 singles and made him one of the most successful singer/songwriters of the modern era.

Along the way, Clint has sold over 20 million records, earned more than a dozen gold and platinum awards in the U.S. and Canada, landed nearly two dozen major awards and nominations, including more than a dozen GRAMMY nominations.

As “a future Country Music Hall of Famer” (*Los Angeles Times*), Clint Black’s continued success can be attributed to his deep sense of country music history

and his humble gratitude in being an important part of it. His awards, including a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, surpass in number his hit records.

Black memorably flexed his acting chops with a cameo in 1994's *Maverick* (alongside Mel Gibson and Jodie Foster), as well as with roles in films such as 2000's *Going Home* (with Jason Robards) and the starring role in 1998's *Still Holding On: The Legend of Cadillac Jack*. *Flicka 2* (with Patrick Warburton) was released in May 2010, which was then followed up in 2012 with *Flicka – Country Pride*, which starred not only Clint, but his wife Lisa and daughter Lily as well. Black has also performed on TV shows including *The Larry Sanders Show*, *Las Vegas*, *King of the Hill* and many others. In addition to a heavy touring schedule, Clint is currently developing a Broadway production based on the life of his friend Roy Rogers.

Raised in the suburbs of Houston, Texas, Clint Black is the youngest of four brothers. He began performing with brother, Kevin at the family's backyard barbecues. After high school, he worked construction for a year and spent 10 years on the local nightclub circuit. He auditioned for a Nashville recording contract in 1988. The following year, he led a movement of young talent that transformed country music into a multi-million dollar industry in the 1990s.

"I don't really feel like I was leading a change in country music," he remarks. "It just felt like big success to me. I would hear things like, 'So-and-so is going to record, and they're using their own band because you did.' Or, 'So-and-so wants to write more of their own songs, because you did.' But I don't feel like I changed anything, other than contributing my work to the big picture. That's my humble assessment of it. It's hard to look at myself and see the impact I've had. I do know that my songs have touched a lot of people."

He married fellow Houstonian, and actress Lisa Hartman in 1991, their daughter Lily Pearl was born in 2001, and the family subsequently relocated from Los Angeles to Nashville.
